



International Primary Curriculum (IPC)



At Parsloes Primary School we aim to deliver a curriculum that is broad, balanced and based on developing all pupils' knowledge, skills and understanding across a range of subjects. To ensure our curriculum meets the needs of our children, we have implemented the International Primary Curriculum (IPC). The IPC is internationally-minded, thematic and cross-curricular and is a curriculum which nurtures a love for learning and encourages children to develop the necessary key skills and personal qualities.

The IPC has an extensive range of thematic units of learning that are exciting, future orientated and aimed at primary aged children (3-12) growing up in the 21st Century. Each IPC unit sets out very clearly what children will learn in each subject and ensures that we are teaching a broad and balanced curriculum that is in line with and supportive of the National Curriculum 2014.



Each IPC unit incorporates a range of subjects including Science, History, Geography, Art, Design Technology, Computing and PE. The units of work are then based around specific targets derived from the learning goals for one or more of these subjects. All units begin with an exciting Entry Point, designed to inspire pupils and spark curiosity and interest, and finish with an Exit Point where children can celebrate their successes and showcase their learning. Throughout the units, there are opportunities for a wide variety of learning experiences including educational visits, community links, etc. The units are fully cross curricular and are linked, where possible, to our core texts and writing genres which enables us to embed literacy across the curriculum.

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
